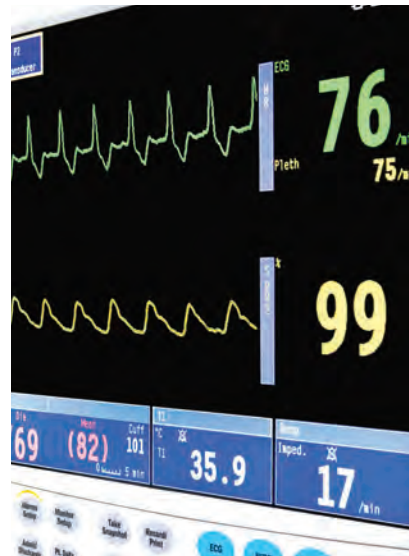

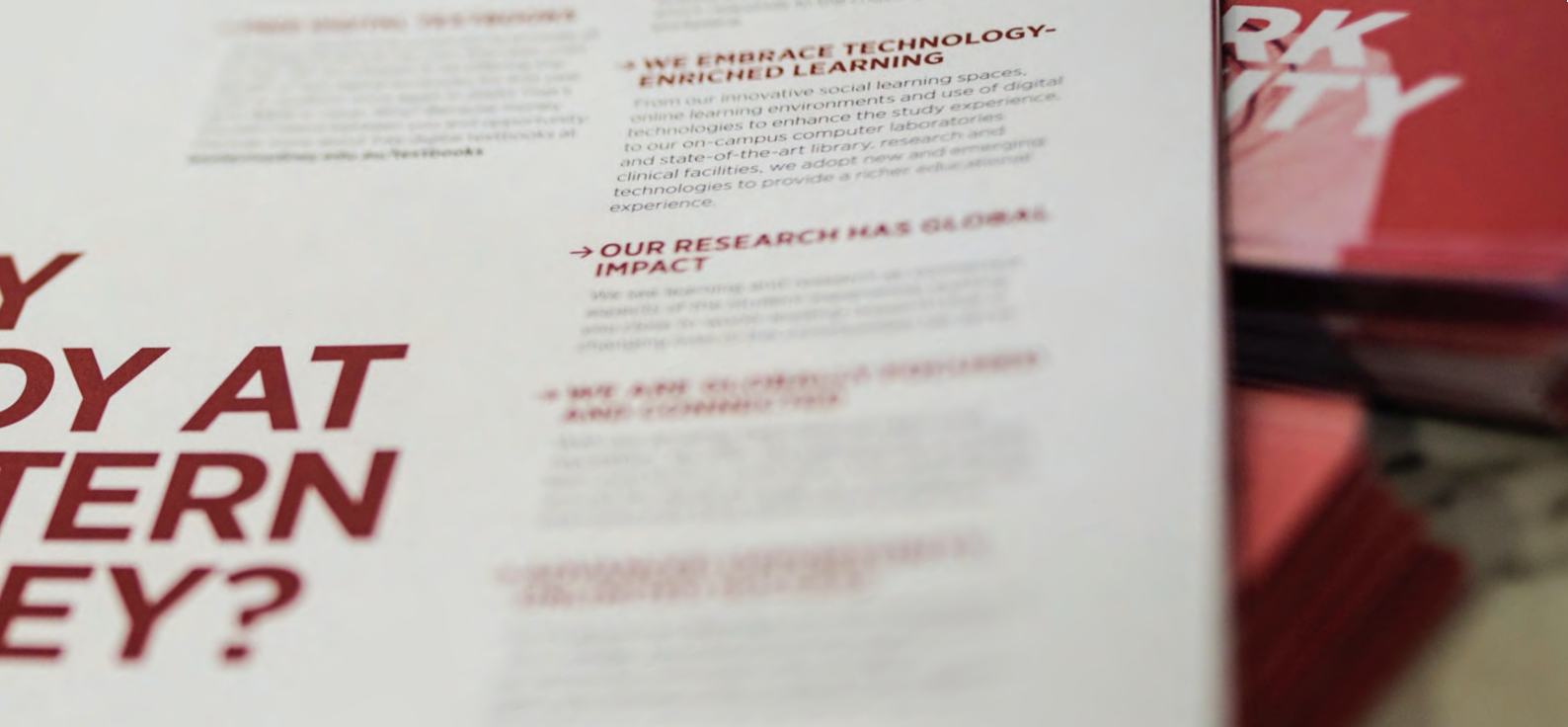

## **WESTERN SYDNEY UNIVERSITY**

## HONG KONG BAPTIST UNIVERSITY

In 1956, Hong Kong Baptist College was founded by the Baptist Convention of Hong Kong as a post-secondary college committed to the provision of whole person education. In 1983, Hong Kong Baptist College became a fully-funded public tertiary institution. It gained university status in 1994 and was renamed Hong Kong Baptist University (HKBU).

Today HKBU encompasses eight Faculties/Schools offering a range of undergraduate programmes, associate degree and higher diploma programmes as well as taught postgraduate programmes and research postgraduate programmes leading to the award of master and doctoral degrees. It prides itself on its dual focus on teaching and research and encourages service to society among its staff and students. ## SCHOOL OF CONTINUING EDUCATION

Established in 1975, the School of Continuing Education (SCE), one of the faculties and schools of Hong Kong Baptist University (HKBU), offers a wide range of full-time and part-time programmes through its College of International Education, Continuing and Professional Education Division, Division of Nursing Education, as well as Early Childhood and Elementary Education Division to meet the needs of the rapidly changing society.

In addition to HKBU's postgraduate, undergraduate, associate degree, higher diploma, diploma and certificate programmes, the School also collaborates with overseas universities to offer programmes which lead to a non-local award. Among the four academic divisions of SCE, Division of Nursing Education aims to provide quality nursing education through its well qualified academic team to equip students with the knowledge, skills and attitudes to excel as competent, compassionate and ethical healthcare professionals.



# THE PROGRAMME

## MASTER OF NURSING (CLINICAL LEADERSHIP)

The programme is uniquely designed for nursing professionals to develop their leadership capacity in a manner that enables them to implement transformative change while maintaining nursing excellence within the clinical practice environment. The programme aims to provide Registered Nurses with the theoretical knowledge and critical thinking skills to prepare them for advanced practice in the clinical setting. Graduates will be able to synthesise and apply advanced nursing concepts in order to lead nursing practice and optimise health outcomes.

### PROGRAMME STRUCTURE (80-CREDIT-POINT PATHWAY)

The Master of Nursing (Clinical Leadership) consists of 7 subjects, totaling 80 credit points.

Each subject is normally in the form of 18-hour face-to-face lectures and tutorials, supplemented by a comprehensive set of self-learning materials and resources. The programme structure is summarized below:

## MASTER OF PRIMARY HEALTH CARE

This programme aims to provide the opportunity for health, and other professionals with primary health care responsibilities to gain knowledge and understanding of primary health care that will enable leadership in this field. The programme provides a focus on the knowledge and behaviour required to be a primary health care provider in a changing community environment. Opportunities will be provided for students to undertake in-depth study into aspects of primary health care that are relevant to their specific areas of work/practice.

### PROGRAMME STRUCTURE (80-CREDIT-POINT PATHWAY)

The Master of Primary Health Care consists of 7 subjects, totaling 80 credit points. Each subject is normally in the form of 18-hour face-to-face lectures and tutorials, supplemented by a comprehensive set of self-learning materials and resources. The programme structure is summarized below:

# PROGRAMME INFORMATION

## MODE OF STUDY

The programmes are offered on a part-time basis. In general, students are required to take 1 subject in each term and should be able to complete the programme within 2 years, depending on students' academic background and clinical experience. Classes are normally held on weekday evenings so as to cater for health professionals who may need to work shifts. A typical term is scheduled as follows:

# PROGRAMME INFORMATION



## TEACHING TEAM

The programmes are conducted through face-to-face teaching by a team of well-qualified and experienced professionals from various health care organizations, educational institutions and industrial sectors.

## ASSESSMENT METHOD

Students' performance in each subject will normally be gauged by two to three pieces of continuous assessment in the form of essays, reports, presentations, case analyses, online quizzes or reflection papers.

## ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT

Class attendance is required for successful completion of a programme. An attendance of 75% is needed for the lecture component of each subject.

## AWARD

Students who have obtained a passing grade and satisfied the attendance requirement in each subject will be granted the award issued by Western Sydney University. The degree awarded carries the same recognition status as in Australia.

# SUPPORTING FACILITIES AND SERVICES



## LIBRARY FACILITIES

High quality references and information services are provided in the libraries where students can get access to an excellent collection of study materials, general reference materials, electronic databases and special collections. With an increasing emphasis on electronic resources, off-campus access to libraries' comprehensive online materials, such as e-journals and e-book, is also available to students over the Internet. To support and enhance learning, students have access to the following libraries:

## SUPPORTING WORKSHOPS

To strengthen students' research and writing skills, the following supporting workshops will be provided at the beginning of the programme:

### Academic Writing Workshop

Assisting students in their academic writing endeavours at the postgraduate level, the workshop provides practical and conceptual information on referencing, critical thinking, reading and writing skills. Students will have hands-on experience in constructing arguments and concept mapping.

### Library Instruction Workshop

This workshop provides an overview of the services and resources available in the HKBU Main Library. To prepare students for completing their assignments, effective search strategies and useful search engines will be introduced in the workshop.

# ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS



## MASTER OF NURSING (CLINICAL LEADERSHIP)

### 80-CREDIT-POINT PATHWAY

1. Applicants must:
  - Be a Registered Nurse (currently registered with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency – Nursing and Midwifery), or eligible for same, or hold a certificate of registration of nursing, within the last five years, in their own country;
  - Have two years full-time equivalent work experience as a registered nurse or registered midwife within the last five years;
  - Have completed an undergraduate degree in health-related sciences (AQF Level 7 or equivalent), in health science, human science, midwifery, naturopathy, nursing, nutrition, psychology OR completed a Graduate Diploma in Nursing (AQF Level 8 or equivalent), or higher, in a health-related discipline.
2. Applicants should possess an appropriate level of English proficiency and may have to provide documentary evidence as deemed necessary.

## MASTER OF PRIMARY HEALTH CARE

### 80-CREDIT-POINT PATHWAY

1. Applicants must have:
  - Completion of an undergraduate degree in health, human biological or behavioural science (equivalent to AQF level 7) or higher.
  - Two years of full time equivalent clinical experience.
2. Applicants should possess an appropriate level of English proficiency and may have to provide documentary evidence as deemed necessary.

## APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Applicants are required to submit the following documents either by post or in-person to the Division of Nursing Education, School of Continuing Education, Hong Kong Baptist University, 2/F, Franki Centre, 320 Junction Road, Kowloon Tong, Kowloon (please mark “Master of Nursing (Clinical Leadership)” or “Master of Primary Health Care” on the envelope):

1. A completed application form, which can be downloaded from the programme website\*;
2. An application fee of HK\$200 (non-refundable), which can be referred to the application fee payment instructions from the programme website\*; and
3. A copy of the following documents:
  - HKID card;
  - Certificate of Registration;
  - Certificate & Transcript of the Bachelor degree;
  - Certificate/Diploma of professional qualifications (if any); and
  - Proof of two years full-time equivalent clinical experience.

## PROGRAMME FEE & SCHEDULE

The tuition fee of the Master of Nursing (Clinical Leadership) programme is HK\$15,750 per 10 credit points; Master of Primary Health Care is HK\$15,000 per 10 credit points for the 2026/27 academic year that is to be paid in instalments on a term basis.
